Ex-council member to discuss work on reconstruction in Afghanistan

The American Association of University Women, Los Gatos Saratoga Branch, will hold a dinner meeting next Thursday at La Hacienda Restaurant, 18840 Saratoga-Los Gatos Road.

The dinner is open to the public and costs \$35 per person.

Rosemary Stasek, a Mountain View city councilwoman and former mayor, will be the guest speaker. The topic of her discussion will be ``Afghanistan Returning to Life," in which she will talk about her experience with young Afghan-Americans working on the reconstruction in Afghanistan for women and girls. In 1999, she traveled to Cuba as a member of a special women's delegation, and last year she was a member of a reconstruction delegation to Afghanistan.

Stasek works in the computer industry as a Web developer and system administrator and spent six years as an instructor at De Anza College.

She has a broad history of political involvement, specializing in women's issues and activism. She has served on the Santa Clara County Commission on the Status of Women and received several awards. Currently, Stasek serves as a member of the U.S. Air Force Space Commanders Group.
